ENGLISH

OBSERVATION I (APR - MAY)

- Recognition of pictures related to small letters of alphabets with their phonetic sounds 'a' to 'd'.
- Simple commands: sit down, stand straight, etc.
- · Stories and rhymes.

OBSERVATION II (JULY)

- Recognition of pictures related to small letters of the alphabets with their phonetic sounds a to i Like g says ग, h says ह
- Simple commands: sit down, stand straight in a line, open your book. They will start speaking small sentences like: I have finished my food. May I go to the washroom? May I come in, stories, rhymes.
- Look at the picture and circle the correct letter.

OBSERVATION IV (OCT - NOV)

- Recognition of pictures related to small letters of the alphabet [n-t] with their phonetic sounds and revision of previous alphabets.
- Simple Sentences: Children should be able to express themselves in short sentences e.g. I want to go to washroom, I have finished my lunch, I have finished my work, Use of excuse me, thank you, please.
- Writing: Strokes and patterns, small letters of alphabets
- Look at the picture and circle the correct letter of the alphabet. Match the small letter of the alphabet with its corresponding picture.
- English Stories and Rhymes.

OBSERVATION V (DEC - JAN)

- Recognition of pictures related to small letters of the alphabet [a-z] and capital A-G with their phonetic sounds.
- Simple Sentences: Children should be able to express themselves in short sentences e.g. I have finished my work, Use of excuse me, thank you, please, may I help you, may I come in, please open my bottle etc.
- Writing: - Writing of small letters of the alphabets s,u,v,w,x,z,l,t,h,b,f,d,k,j
- Look at the picture and circle the correct letter of alphabet.
- Match the small letter of the alphabet with its corresponding picture.
- English Stories and Rhymes.

- Number writing 1-10.
- Revision of concepts -Wet-Dry/Heavy-Light/Up-Down, More /Less, Hot / Cold.
- Draw units 1-9. E.g., 5- 00000
- Related activities will be done (worksheets and numbers book)
- Missing numbers (1-10)
